



SOUTHWESTERN MEDICAL DISTRICT

The Southwestern Medical District delivers renowned health care in partnership with innovative, world-class research and education.

The District, bordered by Mockingbird Lane, Medical District Drive, the Stemmons Freeway, and Maple Avenue, includes a 387-acre medical complex which employs a workforce of nearly 24,500 people.

Its medical facilities attract more than 2.3 million patient visits a year to its clinics and hospitals in the District, providing services from pediatric preventive care to geriatric services, from life-saving emergency care to heart transplants.

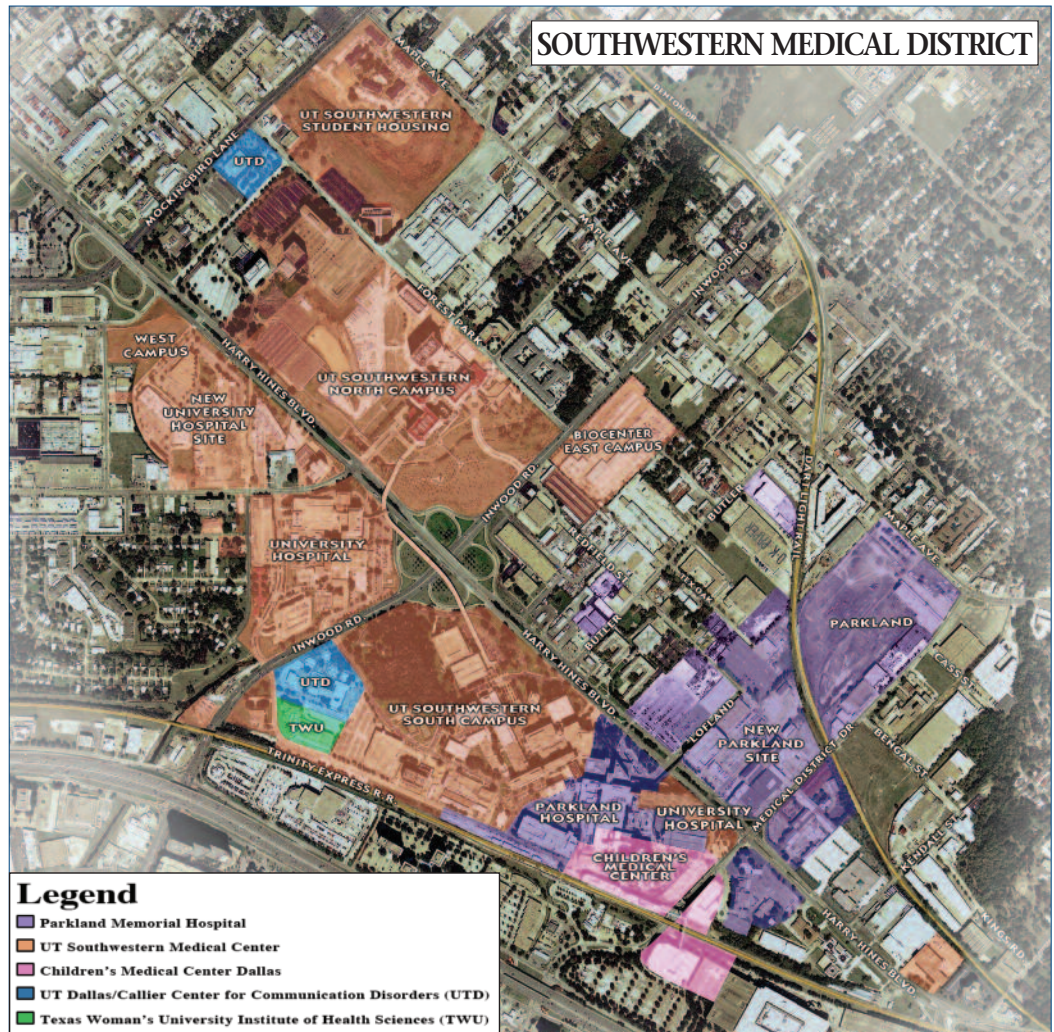
Parkland was the first facility to open in the District in 1954 and soon partnered next door on Harry Hines Boulevard with UT Southwestern Medical Center. Then came what is today known as UT Southwestern University Hospital - St. Paul in 1963, Children's Medical Center Dallas in 1967, and UT Southwestern University Hospital - Zale Lipshy in 1989.

The District's future is one of growth and advancement. Children's has undergone a major renovation, including a 10-story tower that adds services and expands capabilities. Parkland has received voter approval for new hospital facilities which are to be completed by 2014. And the UT System Board of Regents and Texas Higher Education Board have approved UT Southwestern's plans for a new \$800 million state-of-the-art University Hospital, slated to open in 2015.

A 500,000-square-foot biotechnology park on 13 acres, called BioCenter at Southwestern Medical District, is attracting innovative biotech companies to the area as well as increasing research opportunities.

UT Southwestern Medical Center

UT Southwestern Medical Center ranks among the world's top academic medical centers. Its physicians provide the highest quality of care throughout the medical center's hospitals and clinics – health care often based on research conducted in UT Southwestern's own laboratories. Its faculty members – responsible for a broad array of groundbreaking biomedical research advances – are respected for their dedication to teaching and training.



UT Southwestern physicians provide innovative, patient-oriented medical services ranging from preventive care to world-class treatment in a wide variety of specialties, including cardiology, cardiovascular and thoracic surgery, heart and lung transplantation, neurosurgery, orthopaedic surgery, otolaryngology, obstetrics and gynecology, urology, breast surgery, pediatrics, infectious disease, and much more.

The Harold C. Simmons Cancer Center has National Cancer Institute (NCI) designation, an elite distinction held by only the top-tier cancer centers nationwide. The Simmons Cancer Center is the first and only medical center in North Texas to attain this "gold standard" status, bestowed upon the country's top cancer centers in recognition of innovative research and excellence in patient care.

Distinguished faculty members in both clinical and research sciences guide the best and brightest young students who come to UT Southwestern to learn and discover. Its Medical School and School of Health Professions train future health care professionals, while the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences educates the next generation of biomedical scientists.

Research provides the foundation on which world-class medical education and patient care are built. At UT Southwestern, research into the basic life processes and research on specific diseases go hand in hand. Investigations into cancer, neuroscience, heart disease and stroke, arthritis, diabetes and other fields keep UT Southwestern at the forefront of biomedical research, driving the discoveries that lead to new ways to prevent and treat disease.

UT Southwestern operates UT Southwestern University Hospitals and six clinic facilities on the campus, offering comprehensive diagnostic services and therapies for citizens of the DFW Metroplex and around the world. The seven-story Outpatient Building, opened in early 2007, is the medical center's newest clinical facility. The \$75 million, 210,000-square-foot tower is located next to the St. Paul facility and houses a surgical center, radiology imaging services and overnight guest suites as well as clinics, physician's offices and other patient services.

Southwestern Medical Foundation is dedicated to supporting UT Southwestern and its affiliated institutions.

UT Southwestern University Hospitals



St. Paul: The 300-bed facility is located on the northwest quadrant of the Harry Hines Boulevard and Inwood Road intersection. Referral services for UT Southwestern that are primarily based at St. Paul include cardiology, cardiovascular and thoracic surgery, heart and lung transplantation, obstetrics and gynecology, orthopaedic surgery, and vascular surgery. St. Paul Medical Foundation is dedicated to advancing excellent and innovative patient care to these programs.

Zale Lipshy: The 152-bed facility on the South Campus is adjacent to the Charles Cameron Sprague Clinical Sciences Building. Faculty physicians provide diagnostic neurological services and treatments, including stroke patient care, as well as ophthalmology, oral surgery, psychiatric and other services.



General internal medicine and surgery services are offered at both sites as well as breast care, gastroenterology, geriatric services, head and neck surgery, nephrology, surgical oncology, vascular surgery, radiology, and physical medicine and rehabilitation.

Parkland Health & Hospital System

Parkland Health & Hospital System includes Parkland Memorial Hospital, Community Oriented Primary Care health centers, Parkland Community Health Plan, Inc., and the Parkland Foundation as well as many community education and prevention programs.



Parkland Memorial Hospital is the primary adult teaching institution of UT Southwestern, and UT Southwestern's distinguished faculty physicians are responsible for caring for all of the hospital's patients. It serves as a premier training center for the nation's physicians. More than half of the doctors practicing in Dallas received some or all of their training at Parkland. For more than 110 years, Parkland has been the safety net hospital for Dallas County, encompassing early access, primary care and preventive medicine. As the county's only public hospital, Parkland ensures that health care is available to all county residents.

Parkland is consistently ranked among the nation's leading hospitals. Private physicians refer patients to many of Parkland's centers of excellence, including specialty clinics for epilepsy treatment, arrhythmia management and diagnostic cardiology. Its Level I Trauma Center and Burn Center are internationally recognized.

The Regional Burn Center, established in 1962, pioneered skin graft techniques, infection control and nutritional support for burn patients. Its Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit cares for more critically ill infants than any other U.S. hospital.

Parkland's network of 11 neighborhood-based health centers, 11 school-based youth and family centers, and a homeless outreach program provides primary care to reduce illness and death rates from preventable diseases in low-income areas.

Children's Medical Center Dallas

Children's Medical Center pediatric health care system devotes itself solely to caring for the complex medical needs of children. Children's, private and not-for-profit, is one of the largest pediatric health care providers and the nation's only pediatric provider with two full-service, stand-alone hospitals – the main campus in the Medical District, and a second north of the Metroplex in Plano.



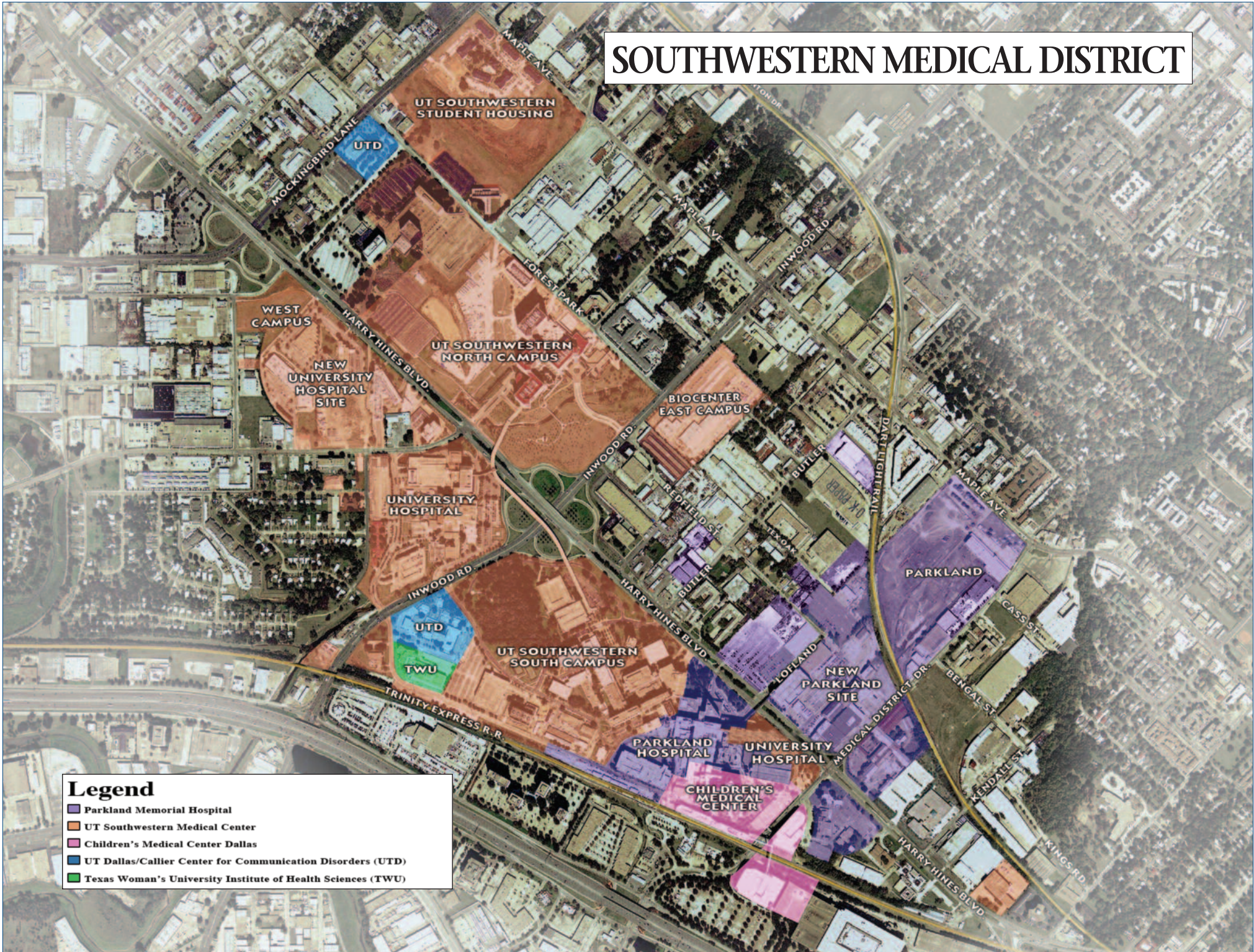
As the primary pediatric teaching hospital for UT Southwestern, Children's is the only academic hospital in North Texas dedicated exclusively to the care of children from birth to age 18. The Medical District facility is licensed for 487 beds and has more than 50 pediatric specialty and subspecialty ambulatory programs. The Dallas campus also includes a state-of-the-art outpatient surgery center, ambulatory care pavilion and outpatient radiology center. Children's is the only pediatric hospital in Texas with a designated Level I trauma center and is designated as a Magnet Recognition Program site by the American Nurses Credentialing Center.

U.S. News & World Report magazine continues to name Children's as one of the nation's top pediatric hospitals. In addition, Children's is one of only 14 national pediatric research centers sanctioned by the National Institutes of Health.

UT Southwestern faculty are members of the Children's medical staff and conduct research instrumental in developing treatments, therapies and greater understanding of pediatric disease.
